Chapter 02 – BUILDING CONSTRUCTION RULES IN BANGLADESH.

Building construction in Bangladesh is regulated by several laws, codes, and guidelines to ensure safety, sustainability, and proper urban planning. These rules are primarily governed by the Bangladesh National Building Code (BNBC), Dhaka Metropolitan Building Construction Rules, and other relevant acts and regulations. Governing Bodies and Regulatory Framework

Environmental Regulations

To minimize environmental impact, the Department of Environment (DOE) mandates:

- Environmental Impact Assessments (EIA) for large projects.
- Waste management and pollution control measures.
- Green building initiatives to promote energy efficiency and sustainable materials.

Construction Approval Process

Before construction begins, approvals must be obtained through the following steps:

1. **Land Clearance** – Verify land ownership and zoning classification.
2. **Building Plan Submission** – Submit architectural and structural drawings to RAJUK or the local authority.
3. **Environmental Clearance** – Obtain approval from the DOE for large-scale projects.
4. **Fire Safety Clearance** – Ensure compliance with FSCD regulations.
5. **Construction Permit** – Obtain final approval before commencing construction.

Penalties for Non-Compliance

Failure to comply with building regulations can result in:

- Fines and legal action by RAJUK or local authorities.
- Demolition of unauthorized structures.
- Cancellation of occupancy permits.
- Environmental penalties for violating ecological regulations.
